RULES

PRESTIGE DANCE AWARDS

ENTRY

- By entering Prestige Dance Awards competitors agree to abide by all rules and conditions.
- All participants, attendees, and staff are expected to maintain a respectful and child-safe environment throughout the event. Any actions or behaviours that jeopardize the safety or well-being of minors will not be tolerated.
- Age is to be taken from January 1st of the current year – Proof of age must be provided if asked for. Competing in the wrong age group will result in disqualification.
- Professional dancers are not permitted to compete in any section. A professional dancer is defined as someone who earns the majority of their income from teaching or performing dance, and has received a paid dance contract. Individuals engaged in full-time dance study at a post-secondary level are also not eligible to enter. Full-time dance study is defined as enrollment in a full-time dance program at a school, college, or conservatory, where students are no longer completing standard academic education.
- By entering Prestige Dance Awards, you give permission for images/videos of your child to be used for media/promotional purposes.
- Competitors can only appear once in a section.
- Prestige Dance Awards does not hold liability to any damages or injuries sustained at the event.
- Competitors may only be accompanied backstage by one individual.
- Bullying will not be tolerated at Prestige Dance Awards. If bullying of any kind occurs, the relevant individuals will be asked to leave the event.
- The adjudicator's decision is final. No discussion between families/competitors and the adjudicator is allowed. If this occurs, the competitor will be disqualified.
- Please note that, depending on the no. of entries in each section, Prestige may combine different sections/age groups to ensure each section has a suitable number of competitors.
- In the event that we reaches capacity with the number of competitors, entries may close early.



THEATRE & DRESSING ROOM ETIQUETTE



- The use of alcohol, drugs and smoking is strictly prohibited on premises.
- All staff at Prestige Dance Awards reserve the rights to refuse entry into the venue.
- No mobile phones or electronic devices are to be used in the auditorium.
- We encourage cheering, but noise levels must remain appropriate coaching from the audience and any distracting comments are not allowed.
- Photography/videography is strictly prohibited inside the theatre, dressing rooms and restrooms.
- Children must be supervised by a parent, guardian, designated adult, or teacher at all times.
- Prestige Dance Awards will have the designated dressing rooms: female-only, male-only, and all-gender. Participants must respect these spaces and stay in their dressing rooms. Restrooms will be available at all venues, and pop-up change tents will be provided for competitors to change costumes comfortably.
- In the event of an accident or illness there will be staff equipped with first aid certification. If emergency medical attention is required, an Ambulance will be called to site – all fees and costs related will be the responsibility of the child's parents/guardians.

FEES

Prestige Dance Awards does not offer refunds, exchanges, or credits for entries if a competitor is unable to attend the event. Event dates are advertised in advance, and competitors must be available on all days, as their age group may be scheduled at any time during the competition. If a competitor is injured or unwell, a credit or refund will be provided upon submission of a medical certificate. Please note that unpaid entries will not be accepted or reserve a place, and the competition may sell out before payment is made. Once entered, Prestige Dance Awards is not liable for any change of mind or scheduling clashes.

SECTIONS

OWN CHOREOGRAPHY

To compete in this section, a competitor must have choreographed their own solo without any input from their dance teachers.

OPEN SOLOS

A competitor/troupe can perform any style/genre of dance however this routine cannot be repeated in any other section. Please note acro & character dances need to be entered into open sections.

TAP/SINGING

Tap shoes must be worn in all tap sections, no pre-recorded tapping is permitted.

Song and tap or song and dance routines are not allowed backing vocals.

DUOS/TRIOS/QUADS

Duos/trios/quads must dance in the age group of the eldest competitor.

IMPROVISATION

During improvisation, competitors will line up on stage. Each will take turns performing 30 seconds of lyrical/contemporary improvisation, followed by 30 seconds of jazz improv. Awards will be given, but no video critiques will be provided. Children must wear appropriate dance attire and footwear of their choice. They will not change shoes between genres.

ALL ABILITIES

All Abilities sections are for dancers with a disability. Each age group will have its own section, scheduled at the start of the day to ensure a calm, non-overwhelming environment for all dancers. Any style of dance can be performed in this section.

FIRST TIMERS

Each age group will have a Classical and Theatrical First Timers section. These sections are for dancers that are in their first year of solos only.

CLASSICAL VARIATIONS

A solo from a classical ballet repertoire, preserving the original choreography and style.



CHAMPIONSHIP SECTIONS

- Please note our championship sections are recommended for intermediate/Advanced dancers.
- To be eligible to compete in any championship section, competitors must compete in a corresponding age group solo to qualify.
- Competitors will perform two different solos showcasing different genres in the championship section. Please note competitors **can only repeat one dance** they have previously performed in the competition. The other solo **must be a routine that has not been performed at the event**.
- Please upload your music in the order the competitor would like to perform their routines.



MUSIC

- Music must be age appropriate and not include swearing or inappropriate language.
- Music must be uploaded via musicuploads.com.au before the cut off date.
- Prestige Dance Awards will send an email reminder when music is ready to be uploaded. If music is not uploaded we will assume you are not competing.
- Please bring a backup USB on the day with all of your music.
- If music fails to play or cuts out during routine, competitors will be allowed to restart their performance.
- Time Limits
 - Solos/duos/trios/quads - 3 minutes
 - Tap/song & tap/song & dance - 4 minutes
 - Troupes - 5 minutes

PROPS

- Prestige Dance Awards takes no responsibility for props and will not replace or repair any damages.
- Prestige Dance Awards is not responsible for moving props on and off stage however, our staff will endeavor to help when they can.
- Dangerous props are not allowed (scissors, knives, tweezers, matches etc).
- Props must be removed from side stage once they have been used.
